S1048	Idaho Hospital Contribution Act (aka Private Hospital UPL Legislation) the bill is being sponsored by Sen. Denton Darrington (R-Declo). The legislation is still awaiting a hearing in the House Health & Welfare Committee. Currently, that committee is prioritizing House bills and RS's and will potentially get to Senate legislation next week. For more information, please review the information sheet.
