1. Biography-Qualifications

Idaho House of Representatives (2008 – 2014); House Assistant Minority Leader (2012 – 2014); Idaho Senate (2014 – present); Senate Minority Caucus Chair (2014 – present); 39 year Boise resident. Bills I sponsored, co-sponsored and supported in 2016 included helping high school students earn college credits free of charge (HB 458), allowing stalking victims to obtain protection orders (SB 1373), requiring testing of sexual assault evidence kits (HB 528), repealing the rule that a victim must put up futile or dangerous resistance in order to convict a rapist (HB 580), allowing the terminally ill to try
