Top Priorities:

My top three priorities are education, equality, and the economy.

Education has seen a 7.4% funding increase for the last 2 years, getting us to 2009 levels. While this is an improvement to freezing teacher salaries, it still leaves us 7 years behind without even accounting for inflation or enrollment growth. We need to keep working to adequately fund Idaho's K-12 schools.

Idaho needs to Add the Words "sexual orientation and gender identity" to our Human Rights Act. We need to treat all people in Idaho with respect and dignity, including our LGBT population. As Idaho's only openly gay legislator, I provide a unique perspective on this issue that is necessary to finally pass this zero-cost legislation.

Idaho's economy can be improved by changing our policies on education and equality, thereby attracting more companies into our state that provide livable wage jobs for hard-working Idaho families.
