

Bill Number and Description**HOUSE BILLS**

HB 392 Zoning Change Appeal (by Rep. Clark): Amends existing law to provide that decisions of a city council regarding the zoning of lands annexed pursuant to any category of annexation shall be subject to judicial review in accordance with the procedures in the Administrative Procedure Act; and to provide that a person having an interest in real property that may be adversely affected by a decision on request by a property owner for establishment of or change in zoning or for conditional rezoning may see judicial review as provided in the Administrative Procedure Act.

HB 396 (by Jaquet): Adds to existing law to create the Idaho Tax Review Commission, to provide for members and terms; and to provide that the Idaho Tax Review Commission shall review exemptions to the sales and use tax.

HB 454 Income Taxes (by Rep. Hart): Amends existing law to delete the income tax on wages and salaries; to increase the rate of the sales tax; and to revise the revenue sharing formula to local units of government.

HB 477 Mortgage Insurers (by MICA): Amends existing law relating to insurance to provide for a waiver and to revise provisions relating to instances where the insurer shall accept no new mortgage guaranty insurance risks.

HB 489 LID Reform (by Moye and Labrador): Amends existing law to provide when a local improvement district is created by resolution of the city council that no bonds, registered warrants or interim warrants in an amount of \$250,000 or more may be issued unless such issuance is approved, either by not less than sixty percent or more of the resident owners of taxable property within the district or two-thirds of the owners of taxable property subject to assessment within such local improvement district voting on the question at an election called for that purpose.

HB 505 Security Deposits (by Jaquet): Amends existing law to provide for interest to be paid on security deposits to be paid to the tenant by a landlord.

HB 507 Contractor Registration (by Contractors Board): Amends existing law relating to the Idaho Contractor Registration Act to revise requirements relating to an application for registration as a contractor; and to revise provisions relating to the board's authority to investigate and discipline.

HB 521 County Recorder Fees (by ILTA and IAC): Amends existing law to revise fees that may be charged by a county recorder to the party procuring his services and to clarify terms.

HB 533 Invasive Species (by Anderson): Amends existing law relating to invasive species to provide for the assessment of fees on sailboats, to revise fee provisions, to provide for replacement stickers, and to provide for stickers for those engaged in the manufacture and sale of vessels.

HB 536 CID Legislation: Amends and repeals existing law relating to community infrastructure districts.

HB 561 Dock Replacement (by Eskridge): Amends existing law to provide that a permit is not required for the replacement of an existing navigational encroachment if certain conditions are met.

HB 590 Septic Regulations (by Gaddas and Gibbs): Adds to existing law relating to health and safety to provide authority for the regulation of residential septic tanks and septic systems.

HB 605 Zoning Change Appeal (by Rep. Clark): Negotiated replacement to HB 392

HB 608 Comp Plan Map Amendments (by Moye): Amends existing law relating to local land use planning to revise provisions relating to a recommendation for an amendment or modification to the comprehensive plan

HB 616 LID Formation (by Moye and Labrador): Replaces HB 489.

HB 667 Public Health Districts (by Anderson): Amends existing law to provide that certain rules of Public Health districts shall expire at a time certain, to provide for certain Public Health district rules to be promulgated through the Board of Environmental Quality and to provide legislative intent regarding certain standards.

HJM 11 Cap and Trade (by Anderson): Stating findings of the Legislature and requesting Congress not pass the "Cap-and-Trade Legislation" as it was adopted by the U.S. House of Representatives in 2009.

RS 19743 (by Loertscher): This legislation would amend the Residential Mortgage Practice Act to eliminate oversight of the Department of Finance with regard to some short sale transactions brokered non-real estate licensees.

SENATE BILLS

S 1248 Real Estate License Law (by IREC): Amends existing law relating to Idaho real estate license law to provide for an exemption review process to determine suitability for licensure for certain revoked licenses.

S 1249 Real Estate License Law (by IREC): Amends existing law relating to Idaho real estate license law to revise requirements relating to errors and omissions insurance; to provide that a licensed salesperson who obtains a broker license shall retain the renewal period and expiration date of his salesperson license; and to require that a licensee make a certain disclosure within a specified amount time.

S 1250 Real Estate License Law (by IREC): This is IREC's annual Housekeeping bill.

S 1251 Real Estate License Law (by IREC): Amends and adds to existing law to revise the Subdivide Lands Disposition Act.

S 1277 (by Senate D's): Adds to existing law to provide for the expiration of income tax credits or deductions or sales tax exemptions unless extended by statute.

S 1323 (by IREC): Replaces S 1249.

S 1325 (by Sen. Bair): Amends existing law relating to the International Fire Code to provide an exemption, to provide that counties may expand the exemption and to provide for notice and hearing.

S 1381 Sales Tax Exemptions (by Winder): Adds to existing law relating to revenue and taxation to provide for annual review of certain exemptions and for the expiration of certain exemptions.

DRSBM184 Short Sales (from Mortimer): This legislation amends real estate license law to define a short sale, and includes language regarding tasks performed by a licensee's employee.

DRSBM195 Short Sales (from Mortimer): This legislation would require any person that buys more than three short sale properties in a year to be a licensed real estate agent.
