## Secretary of State Lawerence Denney Warns Idahoans to Beware of Voter Registration Phone Scam

**Boise, Idaho** – The Idaho Secretary of State has been notified by the National Association of Secretaries of State (NASS) of a potential voter registration phone scam. Officials in two states have confirmed residents have received phone calls requesting personal information while claiming to register them to vote. These calls are currently being investigated by the FBI and Department of Homeland Security.

Idaho does not allow voter registration by phone. Neither election officials nor legitimate voter advocacy groups will ever offer to register voters or mail out absentee ballots solely based on a phone conversation. The Idaho Secretary of State would like to remind the public not to give out personal information over the phone.

"With the General Election rapidly approaching, I urge all eligible Idahoans to register and vote," said Secretary Denney. "The Secretary of State's online voter registration website, IdahoVotes.gov, is safe, secure, and easy to use."
