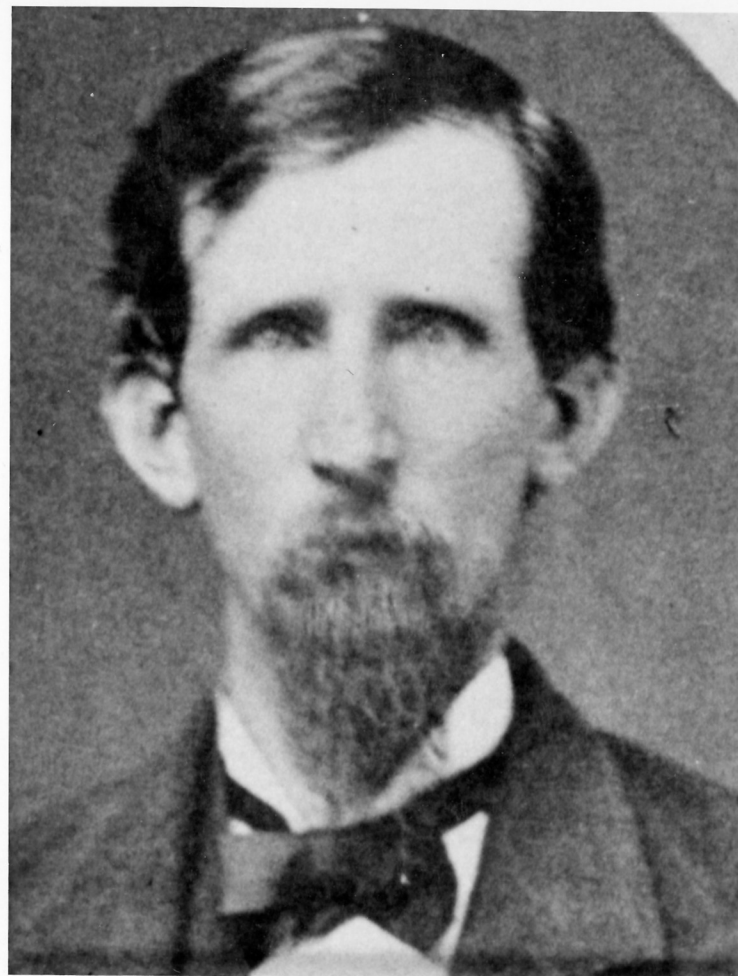
If you come to Boise and have a chance to visit the Idaho State Historical Society Library and Archives, you will find hundreds of photographs, maps and historical documents to view.



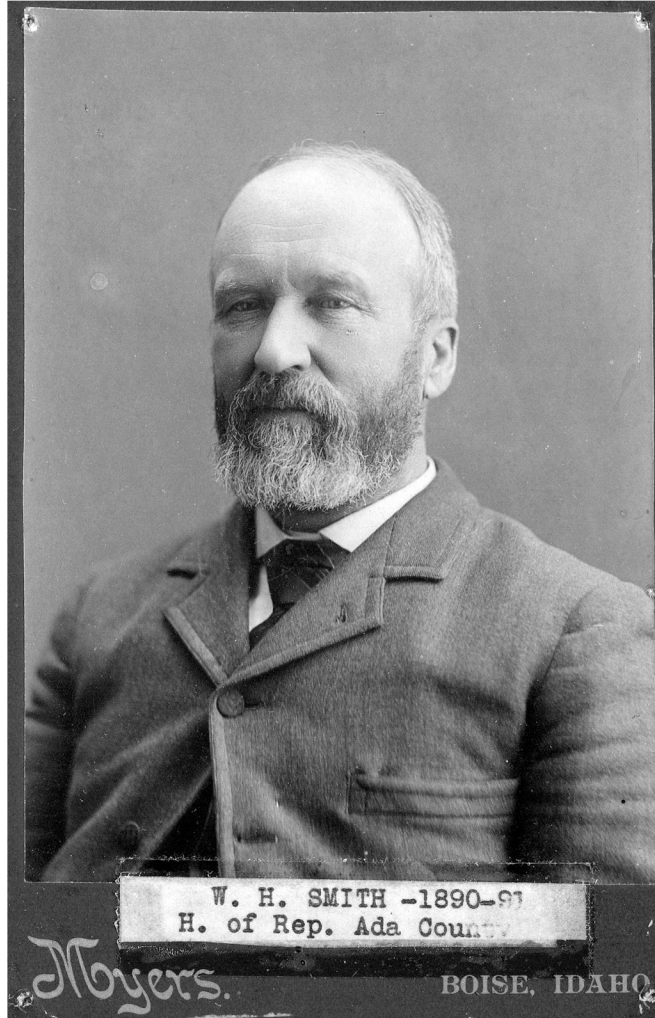

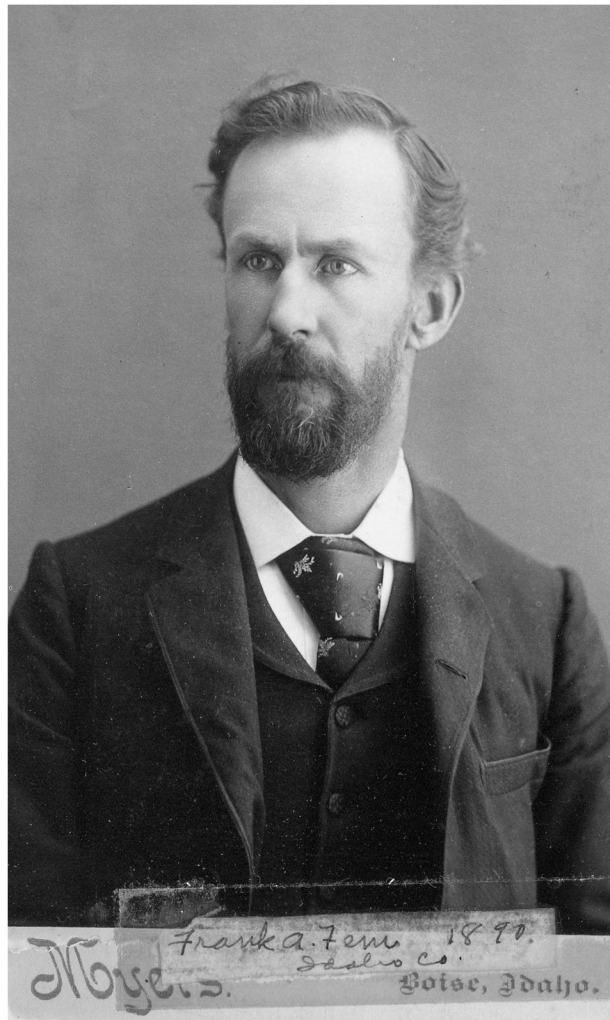

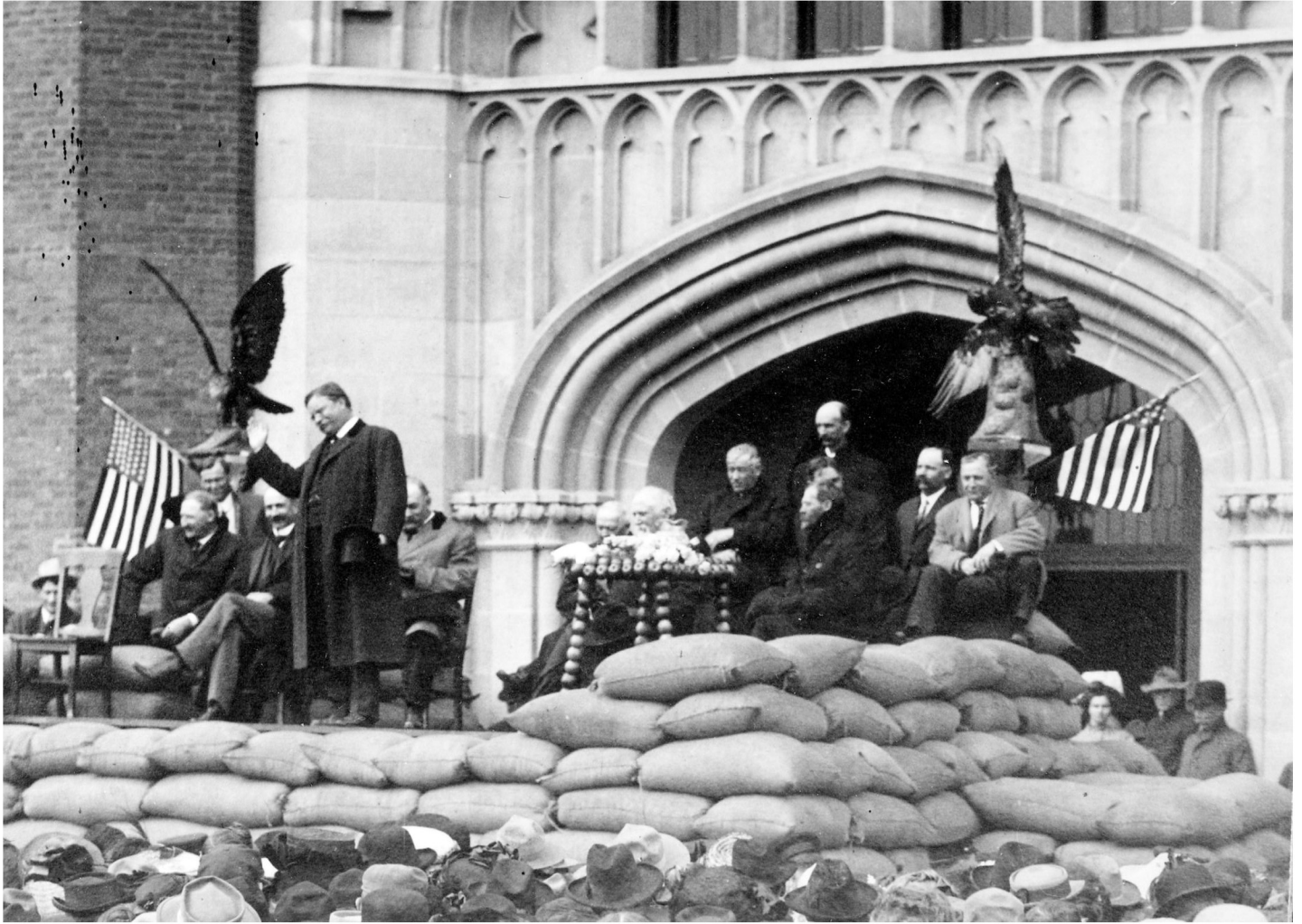

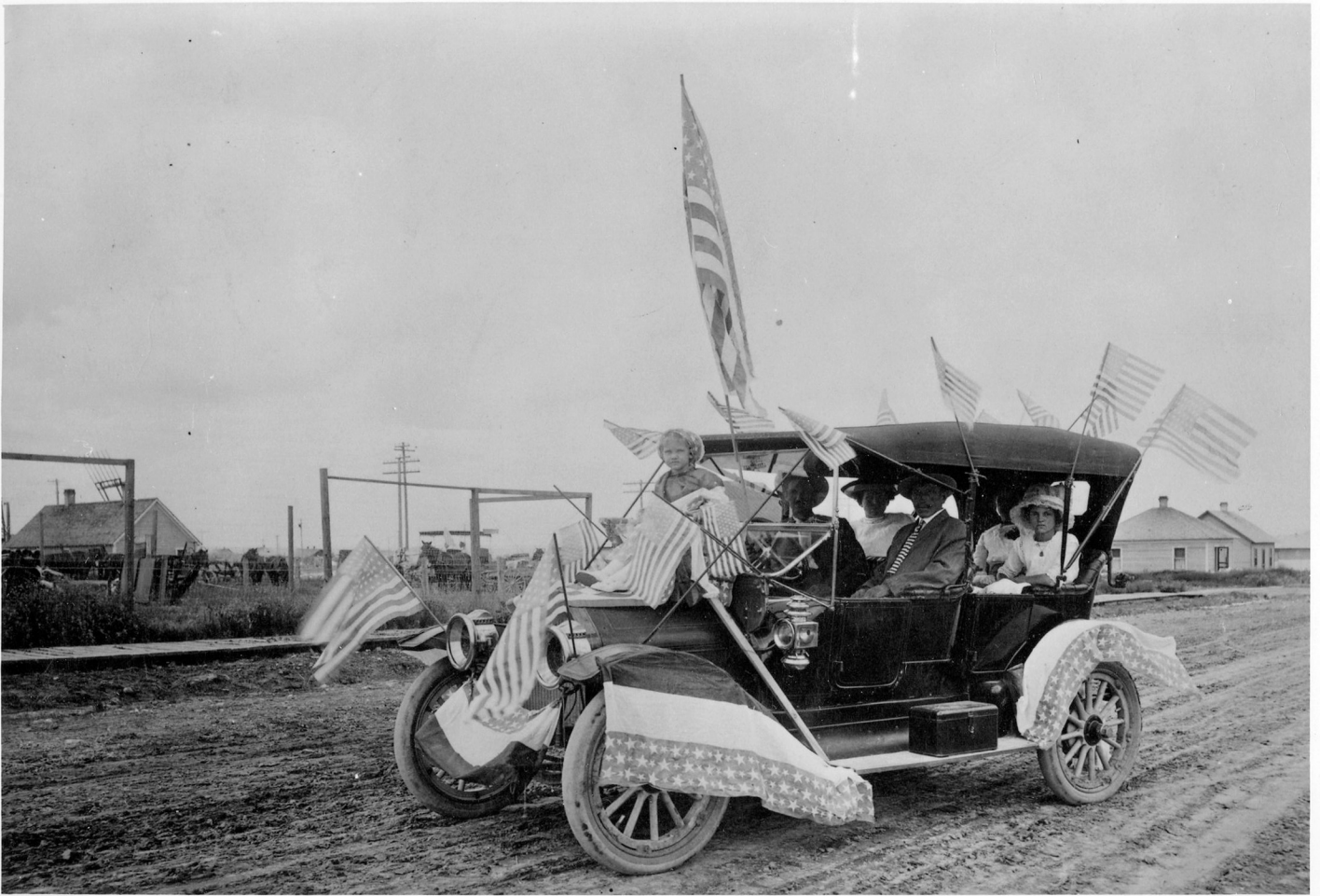

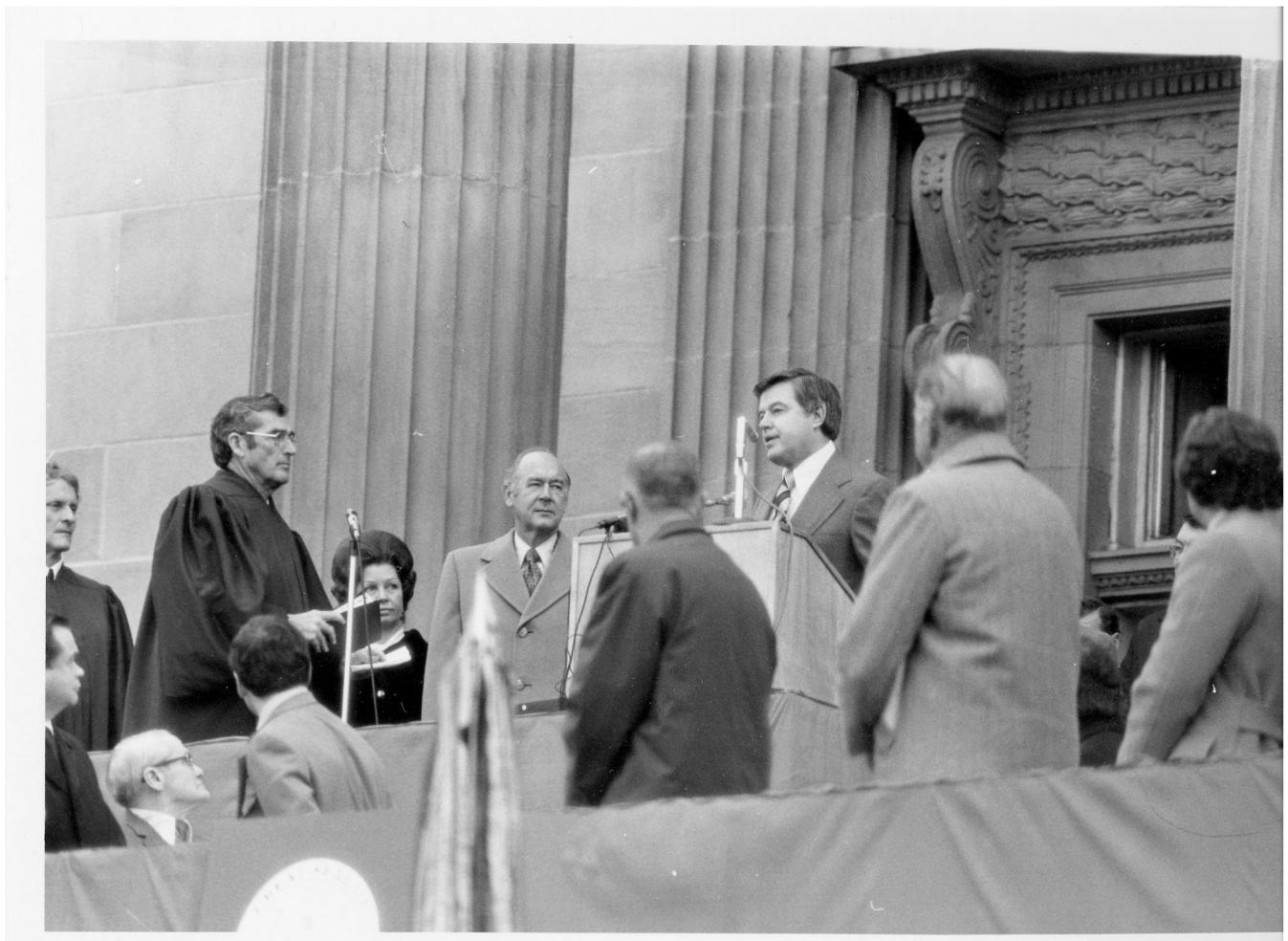

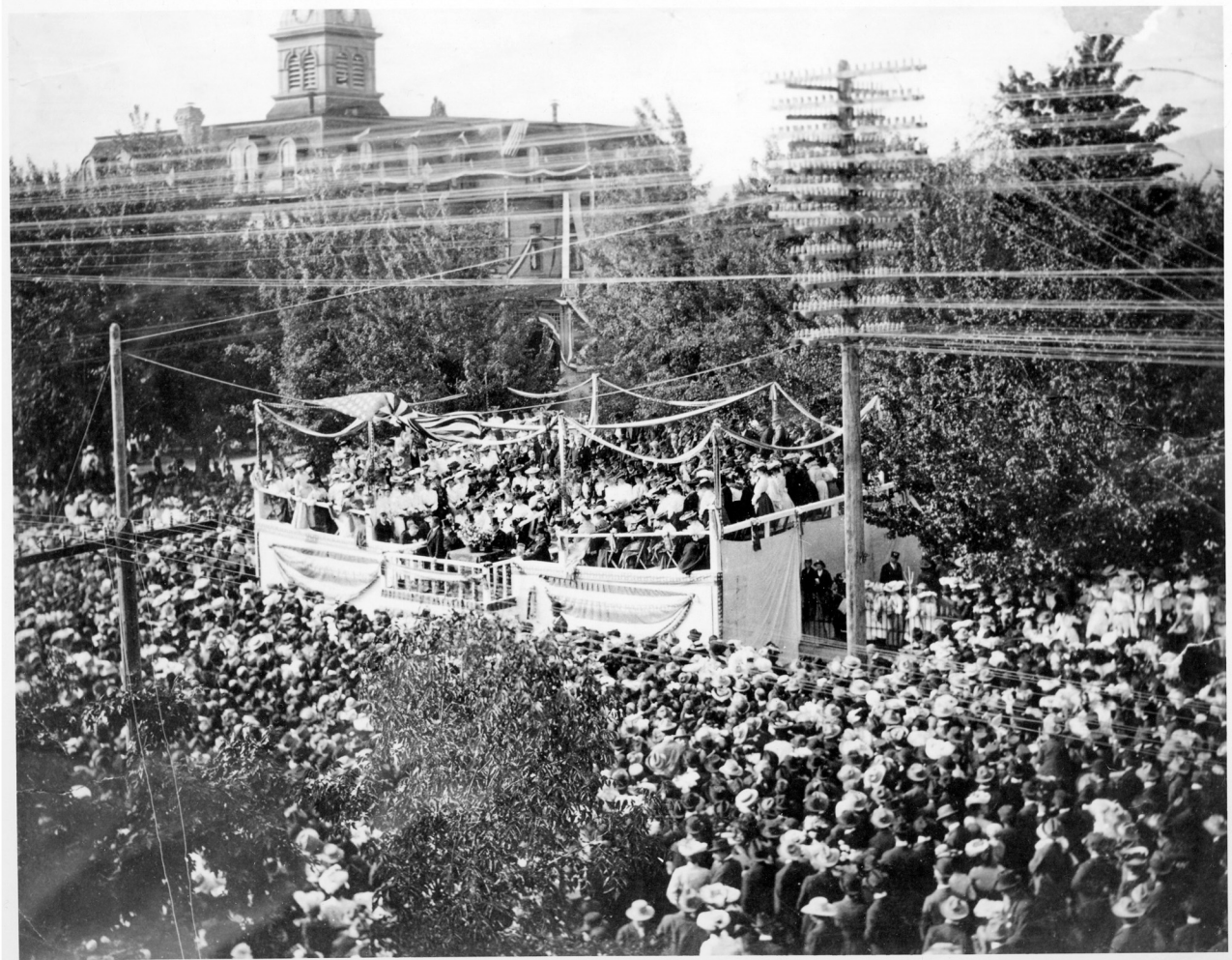

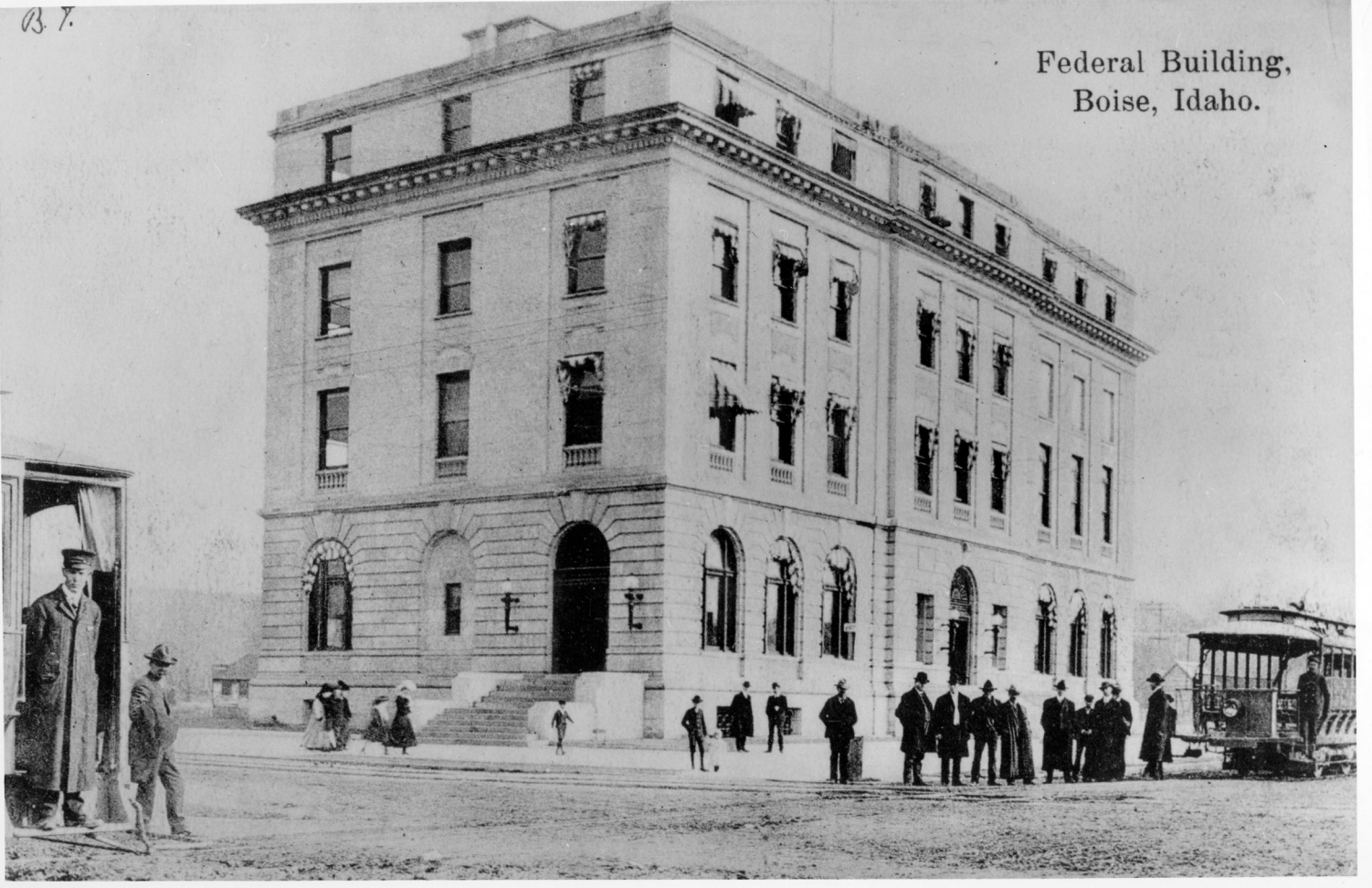

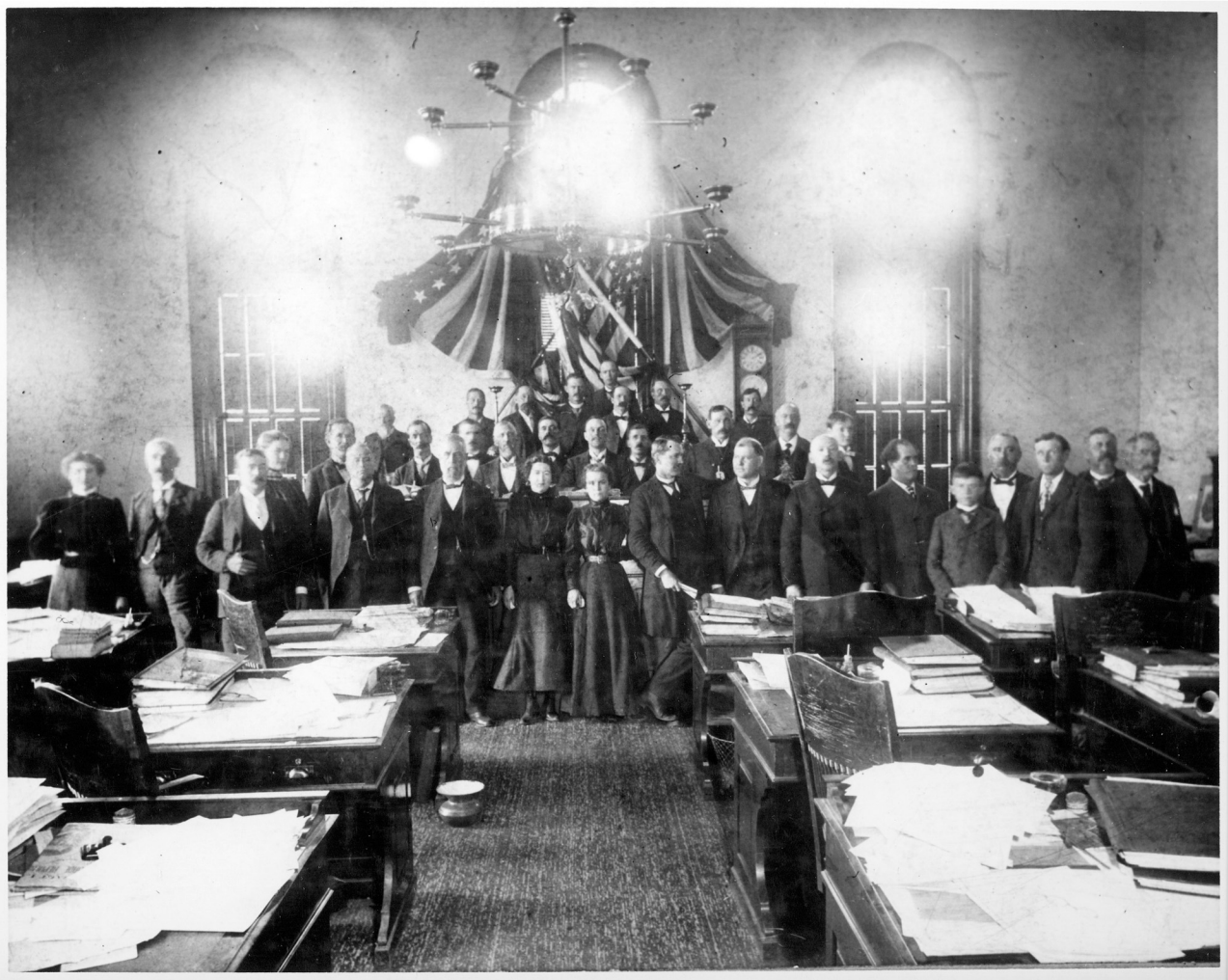

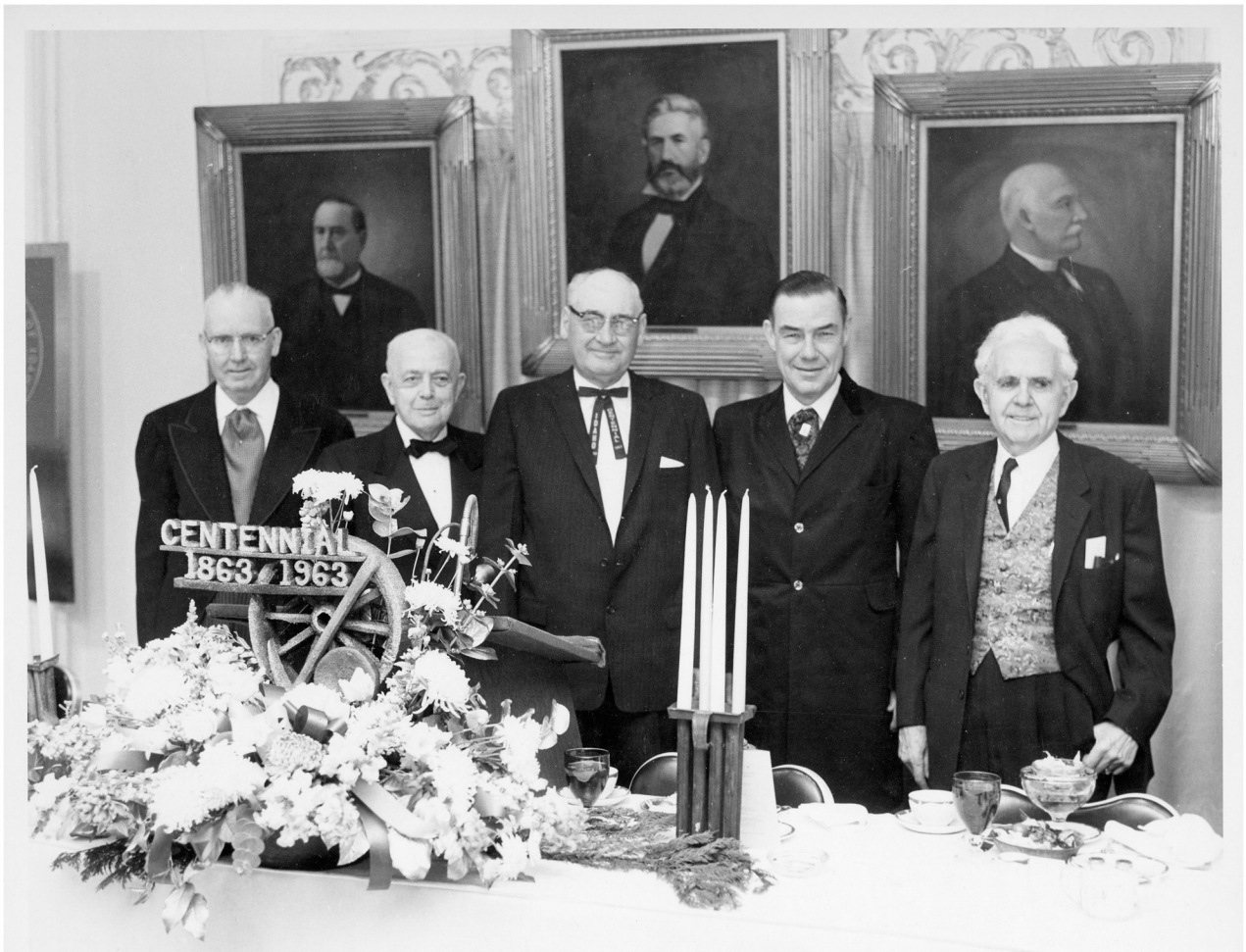

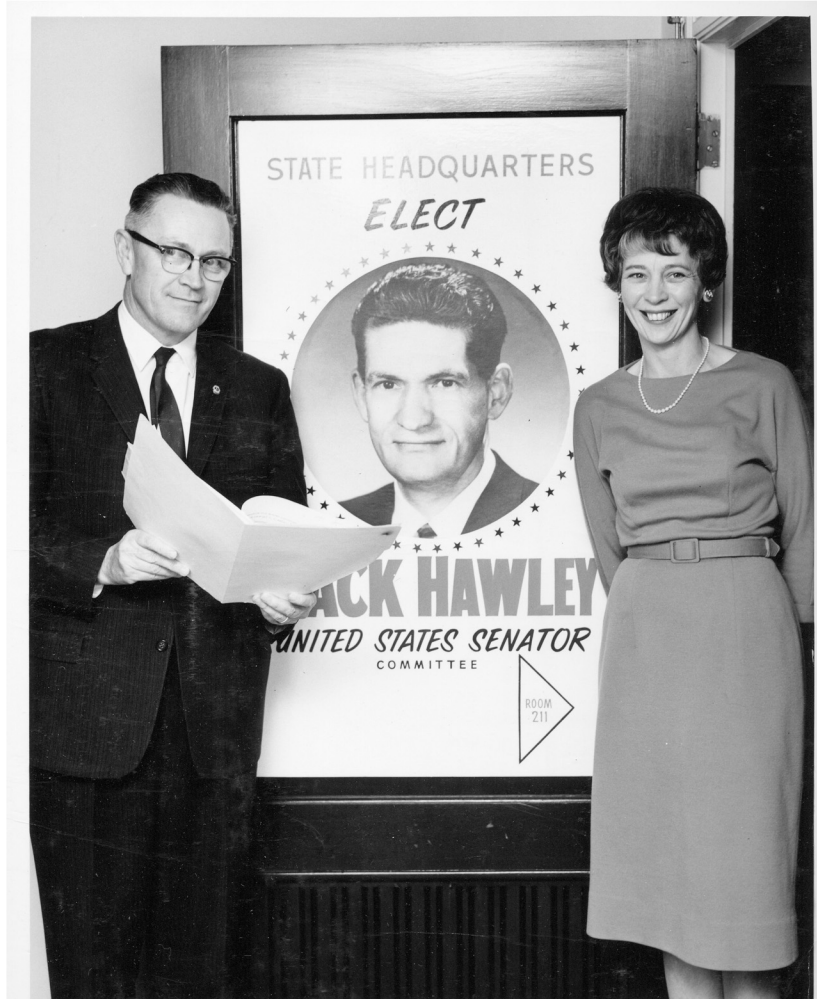

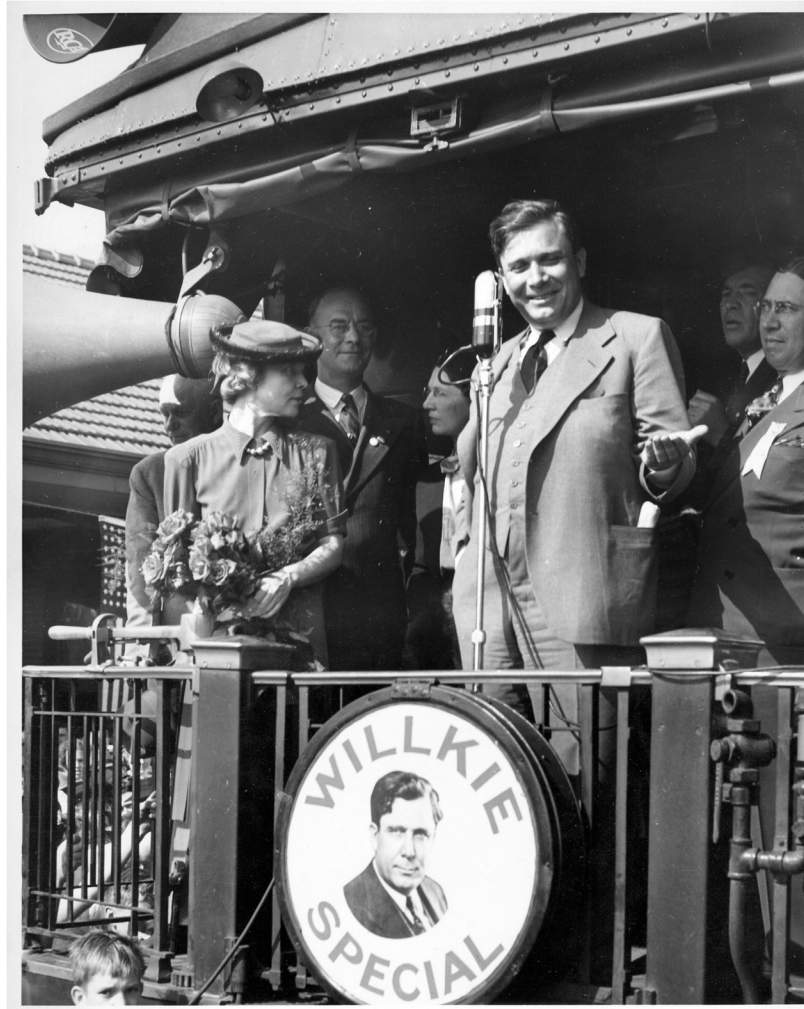

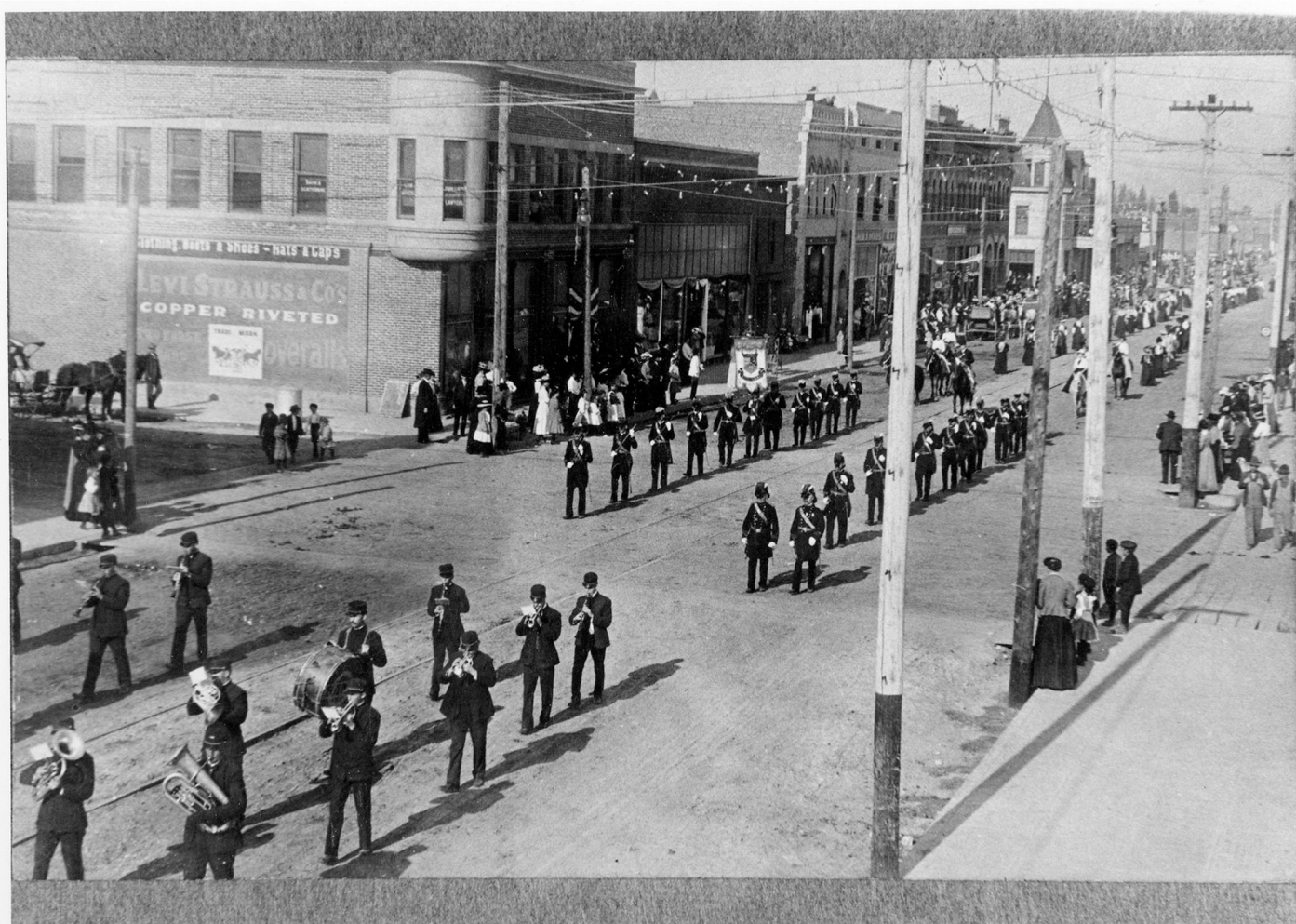

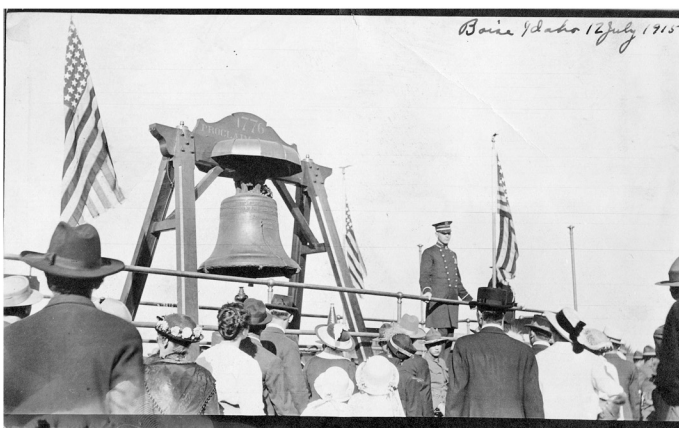

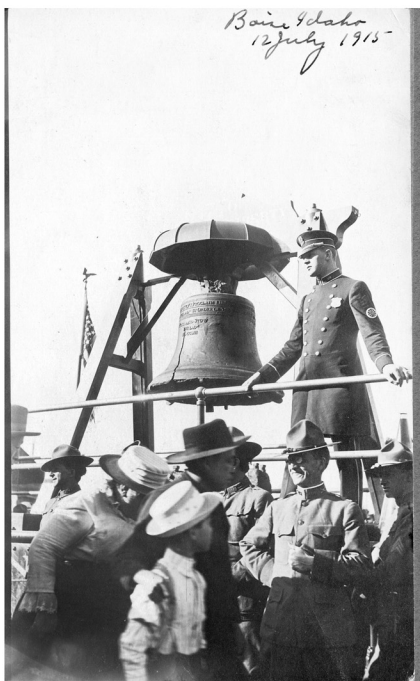

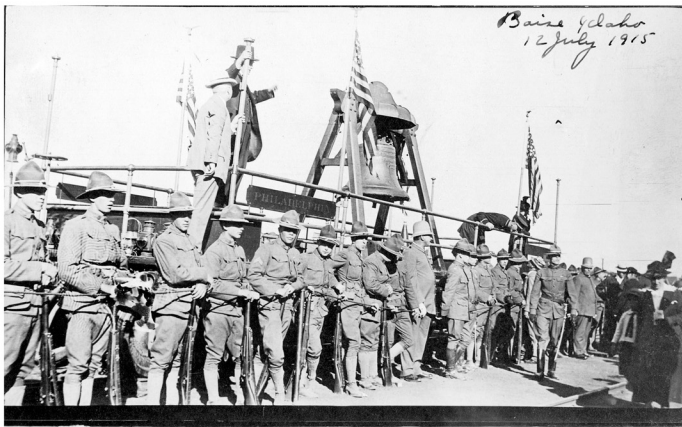

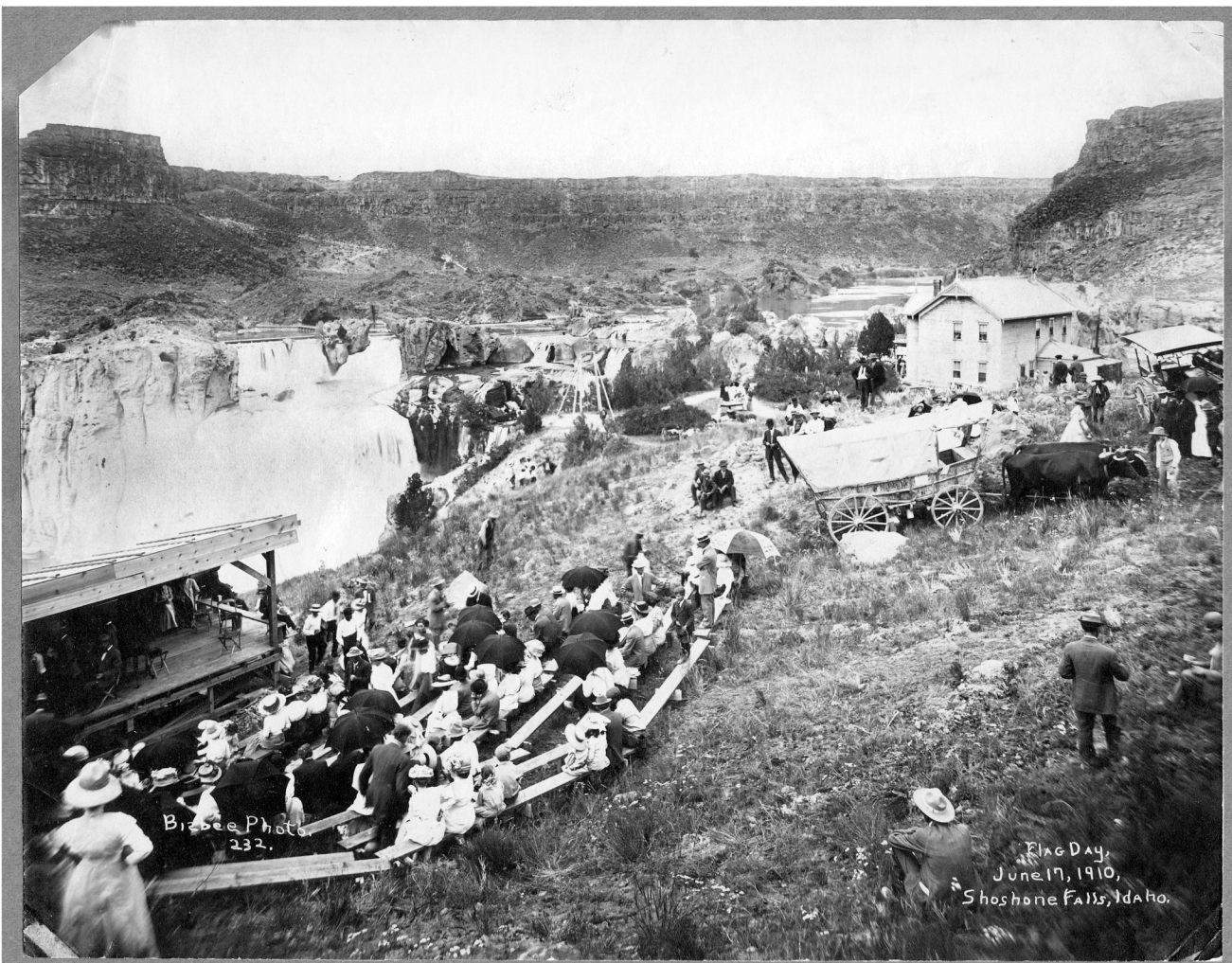
