# INTERNATIONAL CLASS CODES

## GOODS

**1 Chemicals:** Chemicals used in industry, science and photography, as well as in agriculture, horticulture and forestry; unprocessed artificial resins, unprocessed plastics; manures; fire extinguishing compositions; tempering and soldering preparations; chemical substances for preserving foodstuffs; tanning substances; adhesives used in industry.

**2 Paints, Coatings & Pigments:** Paints, varnishes, lacquers; preservatives against rust and against deterioration of wood; colorants; mordants; raw natural resins; metals in foil and powder form for painters, decorators, printers and artists.

**3 Cleaning Products, Bleaching & Abrasives, Cosmetics :** Bleaching preparations and other substances for laundry use; cleaning, polishing, scouring and abrasive preparations; soaps; perfumery, essential oils, cosmetics, hair lotions; dentifrices.

**4 Fuels, Industrial Oils and Greases, Illuminates:** Industrial oils and greases; lubricants; dust absorbing, wetting and binding compositions; fuels (including motor spirit) and illuminants; candles, wicks.

**5 Pharmaceutical, Veterinary Products, Dietetic:** Pharmaceutical, veterinary and sanitary preparations; dietetic substances adapted for medical use, food for babies; plasters, materials for dressings; material for stopping teeth, dental wax; disinfectants; preparations for destroying vermin; fungicides, herbicides.

**6 Metals, Metal Castings, Locks, Safes, Hardware:** Common metals and their alloys; metal building materials; transportable buildings of metal; materials of metal for railway tracks; non-electric cables and wires of common metal; iron mongery, small items of metal hardware; pipes and tubes of metal; safes; goods of common metal not included in other classes; ores.

**7 Machines and Machine Tools, Parts:** Machines and machine tools; motors and engines (except for land vehicles); machine coupling and transmission components (except for land vehicles); agricultural implements other than hand-operated; incubators for eggs.

**8 Hand Tools and Implements, Cutlery:** Hand tools and implements (hand operated); cutlery; side arms; razors.

**9 Computers, Software, Electronic Instruments, & Scientific Appliances:** Computers, their peripherals, software, scientific, nautical, surveying, electric, photographic, cinematographic, optical, weighing, measuring, signaling, checking (supervision), lifesaving and teaching apparatus and instruments; apparatus for recording, transmission or reproduction of sound or images; magnetic data carriers, recording discs; automatic vending machines and mechanisms for coin operated apparatus; cash registers, calculating machines, data processing equipment and computers; fire-extinguishing apparatus.

**10 Medical, Dental Instruments and Apparatus:** Surgical, medical, dental and veterinary apparatus and instruments, artificial limbs, eyes and teeth; orthopedic articles; suture materials.

**11 Appliances, Lighting, Heating, Sanitary Installations:** Apparatus for lighting, heating, steam generating, cooking, refrigerating, drying, ventilating, water supply and sanitary purposes.

**12 Vehicles:** Vehicles; apparatus for locomotion by land, air or water.

**13 Firearms, Explosives and Projectiles:** Firearms; ammunition and projectiles; explosives; fireworks.

**14 Precious Metal Ware, Jewellery:** Precious metals and their alloys and goods in precious metals or coated therewith, not included in other classes; jewelry, precious stones; horological and chronometric instruments.

**15 Musical Instruments and Supplies:** Musical instruments.

**16 Paper, Items made of Paper, Stationary Items:** Paper, cardboard and goods made from these materials, not included in other classes; printed matter; bookbinding material; photographs; stationery; adhesives for stationery or household purposes; artists' materials; paint brushes; typewriters and office requisites (except furniture); instructional and teaching material (except apparatus); plastic materials for packaging (not included in other classes); playing cards; printers' type; printing blocks.

**17 Rubber, Asbestos, Plastic Items:** Rubber, gutta-percha, gum, asbestos, mica and goods made from these materials and not included in other classes; plastics in extruded form for use in manufacture; packing, stopping and insulating materials; flexible pipes, not of metal.

**18 Leather and Substitute Goods:** Leather and imitations of leather, and goods made of these materials and not included in other classes; animal skins, hides; trunks and traveling bags; umbrellas, parasols and walking sticks; whips, harness and saddlery.

**19 Construction Materials (building - non metallic :** Building materials (nonmetallic); nonmetallic rigid pipes for building; asphalt, pitch and bitumen; nonmetallic transportable buildings; monuments, not of metal.

**20 Furniture, Mirrors:** Furniture, mirrors, picture frames; goods (not included in other classes) of wood, cork, reed, cane, wicker, horn, bone, ivory, whalebone, shell, amber, mother-of-pearl, meerschaum and substitutes for all these materials, or of plastics.

**21 Crockery, Containers, Utensils, Brushes, Cleaning Implements:** Household or kitchen utensils and containers (not of precious metal or coated therewith); combs and sponges; brushes (except paint brushes); brush-making materials; articles for cleaning purposes; steel wool; un-worked or semi-worked glass (except glass used in building); glassware, porcelain and earthenware not included in other classes.

**22 Cordage, Ropes, Nets, Awnings, Sacks, Padding:** Ropes, string, nets, tents, awnings, tarpaulins, sails, sacks and bags (not included in other classes); padding and stuffing materials (except of rubber

or plastics); raw fibrous textile materials.

**23 Yarns, Threads:** Yarns and threads, for textile use.

**24 Fabrics, Blankets, Covers, Textile:** Textiles and textile goods, not included in other classes; bed and table covers.

**25 Clothing, Footwear & Headgear:** Clothing, footwear, headgear.

**26 Sewing Notions, Fancy Goods, Lace & Embroidery:** Lace and embroidery, ribbons and braid; buttons, hooks and eyes, pins and needles; artificial flowers.

**27 Carpets, Linoleum, Wall & Floor coverings:** Carpets, rugs, mats and matting, linoleum and other materials for covering existing floors; wall hangings (non-textile).

**28 Games, Toys, Sporting Goods:** Games and playthings; gymnastic and sporting articles not included in other classes; decorations for Christmas trees.

**29 Foods - Dairy, Meat, Fish, Processed & Preserved Foods:** Meat, fish, poultry and game; meat extracts; preserved, dried and cooked fruits and vegetables; jellies, jams, fruit sauces; eggs, milk and milk products; edible oils and fats.

**30 Foods - Spices, Bakery Goods, Ice, Confectionery:** Coffee, tea, cocoa, sugar, rice, tapioca, sago, artificial coffee; flour and preparations made from cereals, bread, pastry and confectionery, ices; honey, treacle; yeast, baking-powder; salt, mustard; vinegar, sauces (condiments); spices; ice.

**31 Fresh Fruit & Vegetables, Live Animals:** Agricultural, horticultural and forestry products and grains not included in other classes; living animals; fresh fruits and vegetables; seeds, natural plants and flowers; foodstuffs for animals, malt.

**32 Beer, Ales, Soft Drinks, Carbonated Waters:** Beers; mineral and aerated waters and other nonalcoholic drinks; fruit drinks and fruit juices; syrups and other preparations for making beverages.

**33 Wines, Spirits, Liqueurs:** Alcoholic beverages (except beers).

**34 Tobacco, Smokers Requisites & Matches:** Tobacco; smokers' articles; matches.

## SERVICES

**35 Advertising, Business Consulting:** Services rendered by persons or organizations principally with the object of: help in the working or management of a commercial undertaking or, help in the management of the business affairs or commercial functions of an industrial or commercial enterprise, as well as services rendered by advertising establishments primarily undertaking communications to the public, declarations or announcements by all means of diffusion and concerning all kinds of goods or services.

**36 Insurance, Financial:** Financial & monetary affairs & services rendered in relations to insurance contracts of all kinds.

**37 Construction, Repair, Cleaning:** Services rendered by contractors or subcontractors in the construction or making of permanent buildings, as well as services rendered by person or organizations engaged in the restoration of objects to their original condition or in their preservation without altering their physical or chemical properties.

**38 Communications:** Services allowing at least one person to communicate with another by a sensory means. Services include those which: allow a person to talk to another, transmit messages from one person to another, & place a person in oral or visual communication with another (radio & television).

**39 Transport, Utilities, Storage, & Warehousing:** Transporting people or goods from one place to another (by rail, road, water, air or pipeline) & services connected with such transport, as well as services relating to the storing of goods in a warehouse or other building for their preservation or guarding. Storage on magnetic media.

**40 Materials Treatment, Working:** Services not included in other classes, rendered by the mechanical or chemical processing or transformation of objects or inorganic or organic substances.

**41 Education, Amusement, Entertainment, Reproduction:** Persons or institutions in the development of mental faculties of persons or animals, as well as services intended to entertain or to engage the attention of others.

**42 Scientific & Technological Services & Research & Design relating thereto:** Scientific and technological services & research and design relating thereto: industrial analysis and research services; design and development of computer hardware and software; legal services.

**43 Services for Providing Food & Drink; Temporary Accommodations:** Persons or establishments whose aim is to prepare food and drink for consumption & services provided to obtain bed & board in hotels, boarding houses or other establishments providing temporary accommodations. Reservation services for travellers accommodations, through travel agencies or brokers; boarding for animals.

**44 Medical Services; Veterinary Services; Hygienic and Beauty Care for Human Beings or Animals:** Medical care, hygienic & and beauty care given by persons or establishments to human beings & animals; includes services relating to the fields of Medical & Veterinary services; hygienic & beauty care for human beings or animals; agriculture, horticulture and forestry services.

**45 Personal & Social Services rendered by others to meet the needs of individuals:** investigation & surveillance services relating to the safety of persons & entities, services provided to individuals in relation with social events, such as social escort services, matrimonial agencies, funeral services.
